About Shivaji University:

Shivaji University, established in 1962, is named after the Great Maratha Warrior and founder of the Maratha empire Chhatrapati Shivaji. It was inaugurated on 18th November, 1962 by Dr. Radhakrishnan, the then President of India. One of the major objectives behind foundation of this University was to cater to the regional needs of South Maharashtra. The jurisdiction of the University is spread over three districts viz. Kolhapur, Sangli and Satara with strength of about 3,00,000 students studying in 280 affiliated colleges and recognised institutes. This region of Maharashtra boasts of rich and varied socio-cultural heritage. Under the innovative and socially reformist leadership of Chhatrapati Shahu Maharaj, the princely ruler of Kolhapur, the city had become at the beginning of this century, a focal point of educational opportunities for all classes and communities of South-Western Maharashtra, and northern parts of neighbouring Karnataka. Shivaji University has been re-accredited by National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) Bangalore, with "A" Grade (CGPA-3.16) (2014) and bagged the 28th (2015) position in the rankings announced by the NIRF of Union Ministry of Human Resource Development (MHRD).

About Sociology Department:

The Department of Sociology was established in the Shivaji University, Kolhapur during the academic year 1970-71. Right from the establishment of the department, it is actively engaged in teaching, research, MoUs, extension activity as well as organizing state and national seminars. This department is the first regional department in Maharashtra State who has successfully organised ISS Conference in 1997. Over the years the department has grown large in terms of academic and research activities, infrastructural development, expansion of faculty and bringing out M. Phil. and Ph.D. students. At present four faculty members and two non-teaching staff are working in the department.

In 1994-95 UGC has sanctioned a resource centre for Sociology of environment. With due recognition of the earlier achievements of the Department, department has been identified by the UGC under UGC- SAP-DRS-Phase-I with the thrust area of Sociology of Development and Environment in 2004-05. After successful completion of two phases in 2015-16, Department has entered in the UGC- SAP-DRS- Phase III receiving the Grant of Rs. 72 Lakhs. The Department of Sociology, Shivaji University, Kolhapur is the second department in the subject of Sociology in the Maharashtra State, who has entered in the III Phase of UGC-SAP.

About Kolhapur City:

Kolhapur city is situated on Mumbai-Bangalore Highway, 450 km away from Mumbai and 600 km away from Bangalore. Kolhapur city is well connected with road and rail facilities. Nearest airport to Kolhapur is Belgaum and Pune. Belgaum is 150 km away from

Kolhapur and Pune is 250 km away from Kolhapur. Private bus service is also available to reach Kolhapur from Mumbai, Pune, Goa, Solapur and Bangalore.

About the Seminar

The UN summit on sustainable development goals (17 SDGs) are a new, universal set of goals, targets and indicators that UN member states will be expected to use to frame their agendas and political policies over the next 15 years (upto 2030) for transform the world. The first and foremost important goal is that ending poverty in all its forms everywhere and the goal tenth is that reduce inequality within and among countries. In the light of this two goals about Indian context, the problem of poverty and social inequalities has long history. After, 75 years of Independence, India has made great progress with significant social, industrial, educational, agricultural and economic developments and the country is now much closer to self-sufficient than ever before. Alleviation of poverty has been the major task of all policies and planning. Nevertheless, poverty and social inequalities are still a major phenomenon in India, largely a result of deep-rooted social and economic structures that perpetuate privilege and limit the opportunities for poor.

The problem of poverty and social inequalities are the national problems being tackled by welfare measures by the government and constitution of India. Poverty is a social phenomenon which denotes that a section of the society is not able to fulfill even its basic necessities of life. In India since long we found poverty and social inequalities based on caste, class, gender, religion etc. There is close association between the poverty and social inequalities in the social life. At present near about 27 million people live below the poverty line. Why such issues are found in free India even after seven decades? Why the poverty and social inequalities are increasing? Why the failure of present policies and poverty alleviation programmes? All such problems need to be probed, discussed and argued in the interest of nation building in the wake of globalizing world and to achieve UN Sustainable Development Goals.

In the light of above, the present proposed National Seminar entitled "**Issues in Poverty and Social Inequalities in India**" will be focusing on following areas;

1. Poverty and Social Inequalities in India: Conceptual/Theoretical Perspectives

2. Causes of Poverty and Social Inequalities and their impact on Indian Society
3. Caste, Class, Gender and Religion based Poverty and Social Inequalities in India
4. Contribution of Social reformers and various movements for bringing social equality and social justice in Indian society.
5. Role of Government and NGOs for eradicating Poverty and Social Inequalities in Tribal, Rural and Urban Society in India.
6. Constitutional safeguards for eradicating Poverty and Social Inequalities.
7. Poverty, Social Inequality and Unorganised Sector.
8. Poverty and Environmental issues in India

1. One abstract should be submitted by each participant.
2. The abstract should include Introduction, Methodology, Core part, Conclusion, including title, author(s) Institution(s), if any acknowledgment with maximum 500 words.
3. Type the title in upper case letters, the names of the authors and their addresses in lower case and underline the name of the presenting author.
4. Paper should be in Microsoft Word, Use Times New Roman and font size 12 in 1.5 line spacing in window 2007 or 2010.
5. Send soft copy of abstract as an attachment file to the email id: **manesuk@gmail.com** on or before 25th, January, 2018, notification of selected abstract upto 30th, January, 2018 and send copy of full paper on or before 25th February, 2018.
6. The reference style should be followed as per Sociological bulletin.
7. Bring the soft and hard copy of abstract and full paper at the time of Seminar.
8. All research papers should be in English language only.
9. Papers presented in Seminar will be published in ISBN Book.
