CERTIFICATE COURSE IN JAPANESE LANGUAGE

Revised Syllabus

General Information:

The *Certificate Course in Japanese Language* is a course of **ONE** year duration with the examination conducted at the end of the academic year. The classes will be held *one hour every day* for four days a week.

Eligibility:

The candidates who have passed HSC (12th Std.) or an equivalent examination are eligible for admission to the Certificate Course in Japanese.

Aims & Objectives:

- 1. Introduction to the Japanese scripts Hiragana, Lagana, Katakana, and about 150 basic kanjis (Chinese characters).
- 2. Introduction to the Japanese phonology.
- 3. Introduction to the elementary Japanese structures containing about 1200 words.
- 4. Introduction to Japan, Japanese Culture, Civilisation etc.

Examination:

The evaluation of *Certificate Course in Japanese* shall consist of two components :

- A) Internal Assesment.
- B) Final Examination.

The weightage of A & B as above shall be 20:80.

- A/ <u>Internal Assesment</u>: It shall be based on
 - 1. Home Assignments
 - 2. General performance in the class
- B/ The **final examination** will consist of one written paper of three hours duration with **80** marks and one oral examination of **50** marks. Total marks **150**.

PAPER – I: (written) JAPANESE LANGUAGE (3 hrs.) Max.Marks - 80

- 1. Translation from and into language.
 - 1) One unknown text from Marathi/English into Japanese. 10
 - 2) One unknown text from Japanese into Marathi/English 10
- 2. Recognition of Kanji Characters 10
- 3. Counters (Counting system) 10
- 4. Conversion of Katakana into English and Vice-versa 10
- 5. Variation in Adjectives and Verbs. 10
- 6. Use of particles 10
- 7. A short essay / Cross word Puzzles 10
- Internal Assessment is of 20 Marks at written paper. 80 + 20 = 100.

ORAL EXAMINATION: 50 marks.

- Dictation A short unseen text passage. (The students are expected to use three scripts suitably).
- Comprehension An unseen paragraph will be given to the students to check both their reading skills and their understanding capacity.
 Questions based on the contents will be asked.
- 3. **Conversation** The students will be asked few daily life expressions as given in the text-book to check their conversational ability. 10
- 4. **Recitation** of a passage/poem to check the accent, fluency etc. 10
- General Questions on Japan, Japanese people, Culture, and
 Civilization, literature etc.(to be asked in Marathi/English) 10

Standard of Passing:

To pass the Certificate Course Examination in **Japanese** a candidate has to obtain at least 35% in written and oral examinations **separately**, but 40% in aggregate and also a minimum of 40% in the Internal Assessment.

| 1 st Class with distinction | 75% or more in the aggregate of the written and oral examinations |
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| 1 st Class | 60% or more but less than 75% in the aggregate of the written and oral examinations |
| 2 nd Class | 50% or more but less than 60% in the aggregate of the written and oral examinations. |
| Pass Class | 40% or more but less than 50% in the aggregate of the written and oral examinations. |

<u>Note</u>: The other rules and regulations relating to Eligibility, TC/MC, *Standard of passing* etc. will be same as the Department has laid down for Russian at the Ad. hoc BOS in Foreign languages from time to time.

<u>Note</u>: The candidate, who has filled the examination form, but either did not appear for the said examination OR failed in any paper/ papers, will have to re-appear for all papers of that course in the next immediately following examination only. Otherwise, he/ she will have to seek fresh admission.

In case of re-appearing at the papers, the previous year's Internal Assessment marks will be valid for the *next one year* only.

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
