Relevance of the course

- This course aims at acquainting the students with major schools in western feminist thought.
- It is designed to develop a critical perspective and enable them to question patriarchal assumptions of existing body of knowledge and integrate gender perspective in their education, research and its application.

Course Structure:

- The course is of 60-hour duration and would spread over one academic term.
- It consists of total 100 marks.
- Theory examination at the end of academic year would carry maximum 80 marks.
- Internal assessment carries maximum 20 marks.

Admission:

- 1. Admission is open for any graduate of any discipline.
- 2. It can be simultaneously pursued along with the other post-graduate course.
- 3. At least 75% attendance is required to enable to student to appear for theory examination.
- **4.** Intake for the course will be 25.
