
Sir,

**Extract of by-laws passed by CBSE for dyslexic children
appearing for SSC.**

Dated February 2001.

RULE 24

**Exemption To Spastic, Blind, Physically Handicapped And
Dyslexic Children**

24 (i) Blind, physically handicapped and dyslexic students appearing for the Secondary School Examination or Senior School Certificate Examination are permitted to use an amanuensis and shall be allowed an additional one-hour (60 minutes) time for each paper.

24 (iii) Dyslexic, spastic candidates and candidates with visual and hearing impairment have the option of studying one compulsory language as against two. This language should be in consonance with the overall spirit of the three language formula prescribed by the Board besides one language, any four of the following subjects will be offered:

Mathematics, Science, Social Science, Another Language, Music, Painting And Home Science.

ADDED RULE

Rule 41(v) Heads of all affiliated institutions shall be required to issue Certificate of School based valuation covering co-cognitive and other related areas of learning, based on continuous and comprehensive evaluation of students who will be completing a course of study of ten years.

ADDED RULE 6.5 :-

The student shall be admitted in Class IX and above in a school affiliated with the Board after the 31st day of August of the year except with prior permission of the Chairman, CBSE/Competent Authority as may have been defined in the State/Union Territory Education Acts. The application for permission to grant admission after 31st of August shall be routed through the Principal of the school specifying the reasons which are unavoidable. The candidate shall complete the required percentage of attendance (75%) for class IX, X, XI, XII as per examination bye-laws of the Board to make him/her eligible for the

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examinations. In such cases where the admission by the candidate could not be taken in a higher class by the stipulated date because of late declaration of results by the Board such permission would not be required, provided the candidate applied for admission within a fortnight of the declaration of the result.

Dear Sir,

This Department has received a request from the Office of the Chief Commissioner for Persons with Disabilities vide letter No. 1/1034-5626 of 2008 dated 8.8.2008 to formulate/circulate guidelines for the education of Dyslexic students in higher education and provide them appropriate interface for their education. The issue has been raised that the facility of scribe, extra time and other such relaxation provided to them at the school level are not being extended at the University level. A copy of instructions issued by CBSE is enclosed for ready reference.

Dyslexia is not included as a disability under the Persons with Disabilities Act, 1995. However, it is appreciated that the students with dyslexia do need some relaxation in facilities like those extended to students with disabilities under Chapter 5 of the persons with Disabilities Act.

In view of the above, I would like to request you to look into the matter and with immediate effect, extend the same benefits/exemptions to dyslexic students pursuing higher education in universities and colleges which have already been extended by the CBSE for dyslexic students to provide them necessary support in view of the peculiar nature of the disability.
