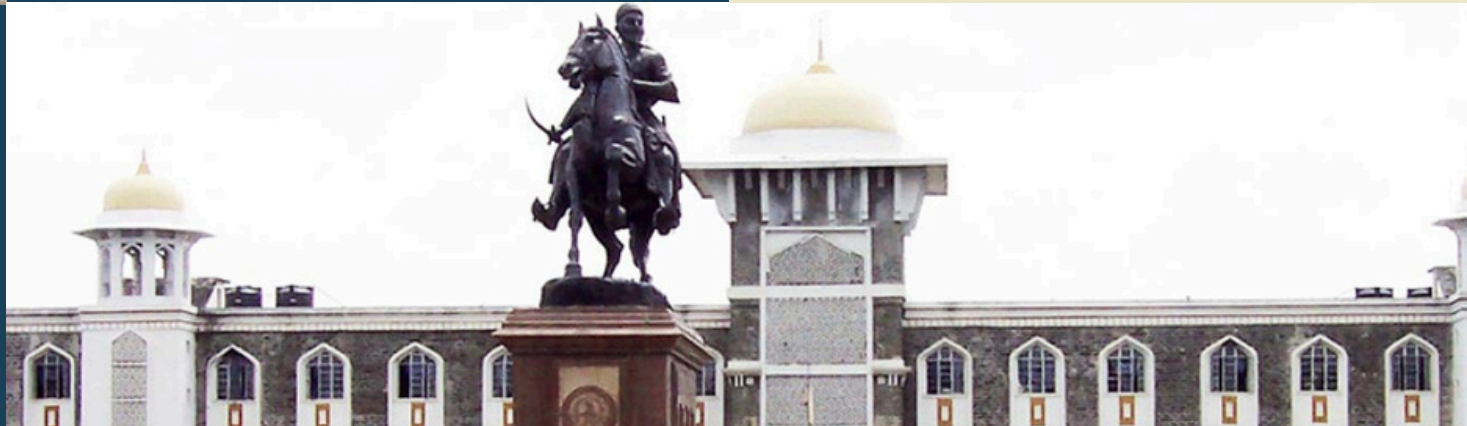

Today, ICSSR shifts focus to authentic engagement with India's diverse realities, fostering original theories and inclusive voices—aligning research with society for an equitable, globally competitive Viksit Bharat by 2047, in harmony with NEP 2020.

About the Department

Since its inception on 7 November 1979, and proudly housed in the building named in honour of the eminent educationist Padma Bhushan Dr. J.P. Naik, the Department of Education has stood as a distinguished centre for advancing pedagogical scholarship and teacher preparation. With a compact yet highly accomplished faculty—one Professor, one Associate Professor, and two Assistant Professors—the Department offers a rich portfolio of programmes: the two-year M.Ed. (launched in 2015–16 in compliance with NCTE norms), the innovative three-year integrated B.Ed.–M.Ed. course (introduced in 2016–17) and B.Sc-B.Ed. (ITEP) in (2024-25) alongside Ph.D. pathways.

Committed to remaining at the forefront of educational thought, the Department continually aligns its teaching and research with UGC and NCTE guidelines, focusing on four dynamic thrust areas: Information and Communication Technology in Education, Inclusive Education, Science Education, and Teacher Education. Presently, promising scholars pursue research under UGC, ICSSR, and University Golden Jubilee fellowships, with one alumnus already distinguished as a UGC Post-Doctoral Fellow.
