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About Barr. Balasaheb Khardekar Knowledge Resource Center:

History :

Shivaji University, Kolhapur was established in the year 1962. The University Library started functioning in June 1964 with a collection of 7000 books. The university library was named as a tribute to the memory of Late Barrister Balasaheb Khardekar as 'Barr. Balasaheb Khardekar Library' on 24th October, 1981 and was inaugurated at the auspicious hands of Hon'ble Shri. O.P. Mehra, the then, Chancellor and Governor of Maharashtra. The new library building of Barrister Balasaheb Khardekar library was inaugurated on 24th January, 1996 at the auspicious hands of Hon'ble Dr. P.C. Alexander, the then, Chancellor and Governor of Maharashtra.

As per the Maharashtra Public Universities Act, 2016 the nomenclature of 'Library' changed to 'Knowledge Resource Center'. Hence, accordingly the name of "Barr. Balasaheb Khardekar Library" was changed to "Barr. Balasaheb Khardekar Knowledge Resource Center" as per the approval of Management Council dated 7th February 2018 (Item No.7) and 27th April 2018 (Item No.21 respectively; Barr. Balasaheb Khardekar Knowledge Resource Center Committee meeting dated 26th March 2018, Item No.11/1). Since then, the University Library is known as "Barr. Balasaheb Khardekar Knowledge Resource Center (BBKKRC)".

BBKKRC aims to be a leading Knowledge Resource Centre with rich collection of information resources, qualitative information services and products suitable for all the academic disciplines.

Apart from the regular users from the university, it is open to other stakeholders like senior citizens and Government servants, persons with disabilities, researchers from other universities and institutes. For any citizen, a nominal reference charge of Rs. 50/- per day for using the library resources from 10.30 am to 6.00 pm is charged.

ICT INFRASTRUCTURE AT BBKKRC:

A] ACADEMIC RESOURCE CENTRE (ARC):

This center was established to acquaint with latest technologies, services and hands on approach to the relevant field of interest in online mode. There are 30 pcs with high speed Wi-Fi connectivity housed at ARC. Researchers can search and access different e-resources, special lectures and hands-on approach are organized on topics like research ethics, writing habits, plagiarism, resume writing, research report writing, citation analysis, journal impact factor,

Moodle e-learning software, publishability. Ph. D. Open defense viva of various departments are arranged at ARC with a seating capacity of 50 students at a time.

B] VIRTUAL CLASSROOM:

With the financial support from RUSA (Rashtriya Uchchatar Shiksha Abhiyan), services of virtual classroom are housed at the extended building of BBKKRC. This classroom is well equipped with modern ICT tools such as touch screen, A/V system, videoconferencing, wi-fi access with a classy seating capacity of 80 for interaction. This facility is meant for offering various workshop/training/user awareness programs on information product and services for the benefit of teachers and research students. All the GIAN (Global Initiative of Academic Networks) programs were held at this center.

C] INTERNET HALL:

Internet Hall were as common facility available to all stake-holders of the University, which is used for Internet surfing, computing, printing etc.

Along with the above-mentioned usage; student feedback process, different workshops, webinars are also conducted at Internet Hall. Infrastructure includes 45 computer devices with high speed Internet connection which can be used during office hours. This facility is run by students under “Work on demand” scheme, under supervision of Internet Unit.

Apart from the above, following ICT infrastructure is available in BBKKRC for smooth working and providing online services:

AUTOMATION AND NETWORKING:

Retro conversion work of active library collection is under process using SOUL 3.0 integrated library management software and the bibliographic information about the collection is made available on internet through library OPAC/Web OPAC system. In line with this, acquisition module, technical processing module for new purchase, and circulation module for issue and return of books to the readers has been initiated with the SOUL 3.0 integrated library management software. OPAC, Internet and e-resource/online facility is made available with the help of 95 computers and 27 Terminals.

The University has signed MoU with INFLIBNET Centre, Gandhinagar for 'Shodh-Ganga ETD

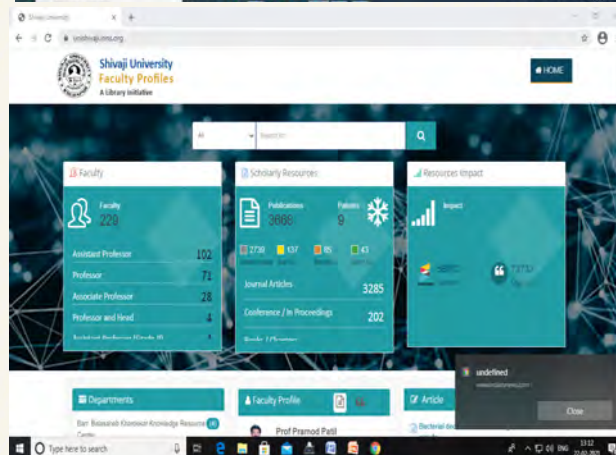
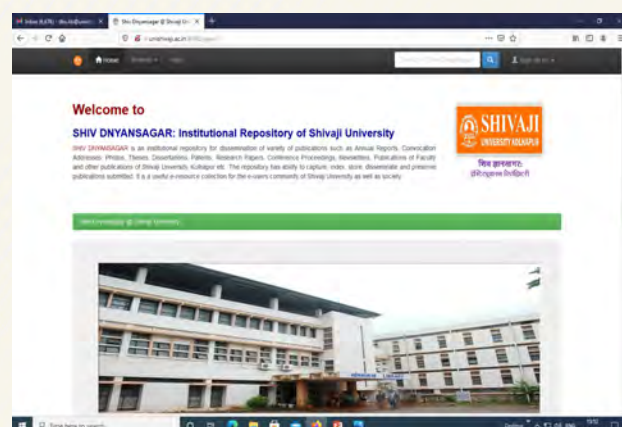
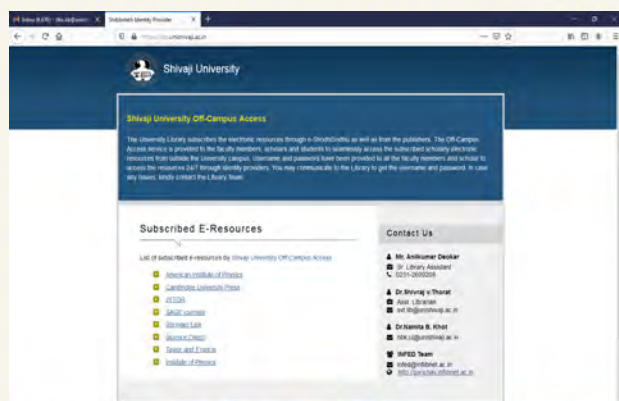

RESOURCE CENTER FOR INCLUSIVE EDUCATION (RCIE):

As per the sanction letter no.16-17/375 dated 09/09/2016 from the Rashtriya Uchchatar Shiksha Abhiyan (RUSA) office, Government of Maharashtra, sanctioned RCIE center to Shivaji University, Kolhapur with a financial grant of Rs. 15 Lakhs. The center is housed in extended library building of BBKKRC with a mission to empower the persons with disabilities through inclusive higher education. The centre works for the inclusion and development of visually impaired, hearing disabled, orthopedically impaired and mentally challenged students from affiliated colleges of Shivaji University and its departments, special schools for persons with disabilities. The center is well equipped with Braille books, e-resources, audio books, computers with screen reading software, internet/Wi-Fi, low vision devices (Magnifiers, CCTV, Spectacles etc.) for low vision students.

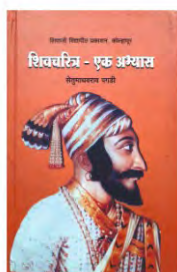
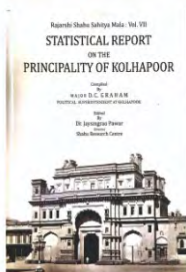

ARCHIVAL COLLECTIONS:

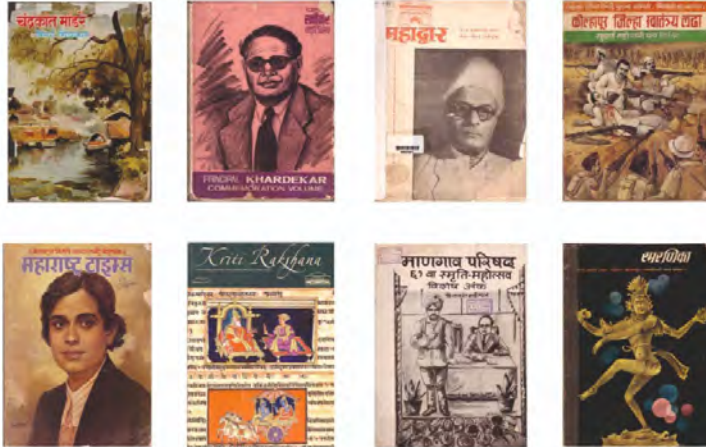
Archival cell consists of about 55,338 rare books, which are donated by various eminent scholars and personalities. The rare books from 1716 to 1950 A.D. and more than 50 special collections are available in archival section. About 9163 Manuscripts are available in the Archival Cell on various subjects such as Vedanta, Dharmashastra, Nyayashastra, Jotishya, Vaidak, History, Puran, Literature, Kavya, Natak(Drama), Yoga etc. Besides the rare books and

manuscripts different archival material is also available in the cell. Old Newspapers like Din Bandhu, Bombay (1893-1912), Rashtraveer, Belgaum (1920-1947), Hunter, Akhand Bharat (Kolhapur), Vijayi Maratha, Kolhapur (1919-1932), Din Mitra, Taravadi etc. are available in the cell. Preservation of rare materials is made at fumigation chamber by various chemicals.

MANUSCRIPT RESOURCE CENTER (MRC):

National mission for Manuscripts (NMM), Ministry of Culture, Government of India sanctioned MRC to the University in the year 2012. The objective is to make survey and documentation work of manuscript in the specified region of Shivaji University and suppose to help in the National survey of manuscripts by building a network with private and institutional custodians of Manuscripts. The Mission liaises with arrangement of awareness campaigns and outreach activities such as lectures, school theater programme and training workshops in the area of Manuscriptology and Paleography. The first project period was 2012-2017 now extended up to 2021; Grants received is 15 Lacks. Dr. Namita Khot is working as co-ordinator of this prestigious project. Since then 1200 manuscripts are documented and reported to NMM.

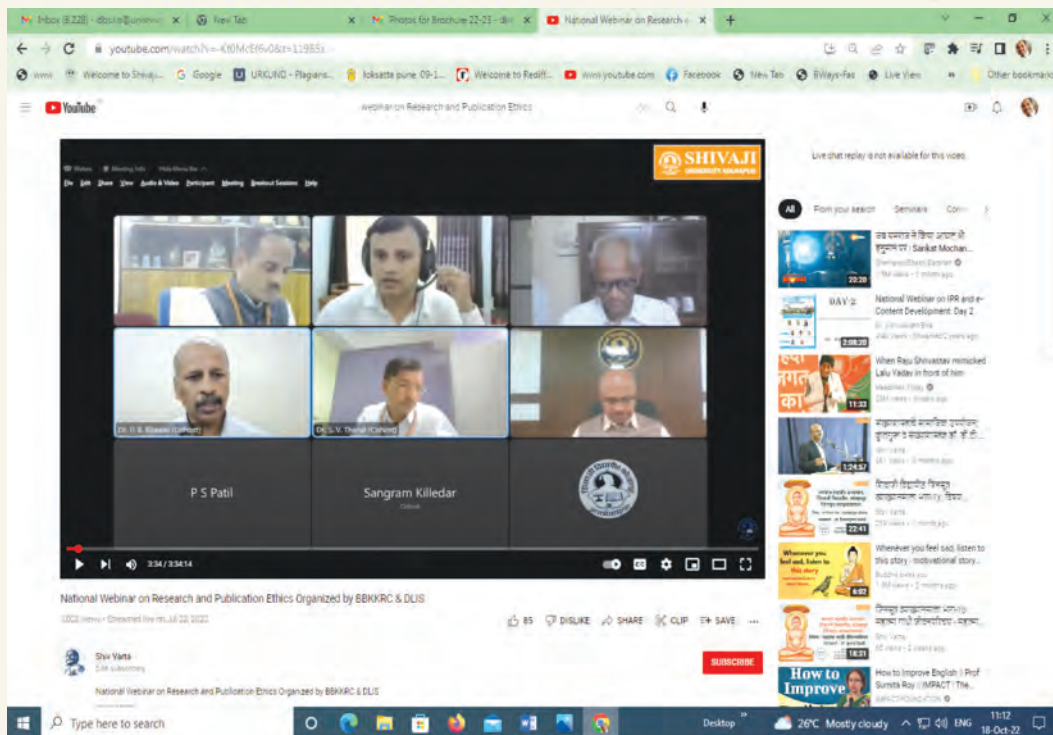
