Student Satisfaction Survey (2020-21)

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About Survey:

We have taken the feedback from our students on their satisfaction about various parameters such as syllabus completion, teaching and their teacher's preparedness, initiatives take by their institution for their development etc. We have designed a special feedback form on "Student Satisfaction". That feedback form consists of 20 questions related to syllabus completion, teaching and their teacher's preparedness; initiatives take by their institution for their development etc. The students are asked to give their feedback on 0 to 4 Likert scale where 0 – (Below 30%), 1– (30% to 54%), 2–(55% to 69%), 3–(70% to 84%) and 4–(85% to 100%). The set of questions is given in the following table.




From the table No.1, it is observed that more than 77 % students responded that 70% and more of their syllabus was covered in the class.

From the Table No. 2 , it is observe that more than 94% of students responded that their teachers prepare well for the classes was satisfactorily and thoroughly .




How well were the teachers able to communicate?

From the table No. 3, it is observed that more than 87% of students responded that teachers are ably effective in communication.




The teacher's approach to teaching can best be described.

From the table No. 4, it is observed that more than 74% of students responded that the teacher's approach to teaching can best be described.




Fairness of the internal evaluation process by the teachers.

From the table No. 5, it is observed that more than 89% of students responded that teachers are fair in the internal evaluation process.



From the table No. 06, it is observed that more than 82% of students responded that Every time and usually teachers discuss their performance of assignments.









From the table No. 13, it is observed that more than 86% of students responded that their teachers fully and reasonably identify your strengths and encourage you with providing right level of challenges.




Teachers are able to identify your weaknesses and help you to overcome them.









7) 73% of students responded that the institute takes active interest in promoting internship, student exchange, field visit opportunities for them.
