#### Description

Shivaji University Kolhapur was established in 1962. The establishment of Shivaji University was the culmination and fulfilment of the long cherished aspirations of the people of this region. Under the able leadership of Late Dr. Appasaheb Pawar, the first Vice-Chancellor of this University embarked upon the progress which was traversed by his successors. In 1962, the University started functioning with just 34 affiliated colleges and about 14000 students with 5 post-graduate Departments on campus. Today, the number of affiliated colleges has gone upto 286 and students strength upto 2,50,000 with 34 post-graduate Departments on campus. In the year 2021, Shivaji University completed the fourth cycle of reaccreditation by NAAC, Bangalore and has been awarded 'A++' grade with CGPA 3.52. The untiring efforts in the new millennium have brought this University a nationwide recognition and honour as it stood in QS World University Ranking 2023 in the rank of 501-550 and 131st rank in the Southern Asia Ranking. As per Standford University Ranking 2022, 10 faculty members of Shivaji University are ranked among top 2% Scientist of the World. Almost 95 plus faculty and researchers of Shivaji University are in the list of A.D. Scientific Index of 2023, NIRF Ranking is in the Rank Band of 151-200. The University is recognized as ISO 9001-2015 certification. The UGC has granted Shivaji University, Kolhapur as Category-I University under UGC Categorization of universities (Only) for grant of graded autonomy as per Regulation 2018. Shivaji University is committed to meet the Educational, Social, Cultural & Economic needs of the region to create a just and Humane Society. The University is dedicated to promote and foster a culture of high-quality teaching and learning and to serve societal needs by encouraging, generating and promoting excellence in research and extension activities. It is abide by uncompromising adherence to values and implementation of high quality educational programmes and healthy practices with a view to creating and developing a large and rich pool of selfless young men and women, capable of ensuing for themselves a decent livelihood and meeting the growing needs of a developing society. A choice- based credit system (CBCS) is implemented by the University at PG level, since 2013. Shivaji University is one of the leading Universities in the State of Maharashtra to implement NEP 2020. The large number of awareness programmes about NEP 2020 were conducted for all the stakeholders. The academic council of Shivaji University has passed "The regulations Governing The Choice Based Credit System with Multiple Entry and Multiple Exit Options" and implemented the course wise structure for UG and PG programmes from 2022-23. University is registered on ABC portal. Presently 98% students of all first year programmes have opened their ABC accounts. Presently, Shivaji University imparts education in four faculties viz. Science & Technology, Commerce and Management, Humanities and Inter-Disciplinary Studies. In the Faculty of Science and Technology, multiple approaches have been initiated to achieve the high standards of teaching and research by finding new avenues in fields of physical, chemical and life sciences. The faculty of Humanities is also taking apt steps to advance, promote and propel the economic, social, political and cultural development of the students through innovative teaching programs. Noteworthy reforms in their pedagogical model by inculcating technology enhanced language teaching has been taken up. The Department of Technology is also geared up by starting undergraduate and postgraduate programmes in the frontier areas of importance and offering competitive academic programmes such as B.Tech., M.Tech. and M.B.A. The University is also keen on harnessing the ICT based instructive strategies by equipping the faculty members and instituting smart classroom facilities in many Departments. Advanced Technology Centre is established in collaboration with MSME Technology Centre-Indo German Tool Room, Aurangabad for Training Research and Development. Shivaji University has been very active in the research at national as well as international level. The same has been reflected in the research metrics of the University (SCOPUS). The faculty members of the Shivaji University have made significant contributions in various fields of Science and Technology and other faculties. The major areas of research include Nano Technology, Materials Science, Green Chemistry, VLSI techniques, Process Control, Internet of Things, Data Mining, Data Analytics, Energy Technology, Space Science, Agro based Economics, Pollution Control, Nutraceutical Foods, Geo-informatics, Linguistics, e-Commerce, etc. The research carried out by the University is supported by the leading funding agencies like DST,DAE-BRNS, UGC, CSIR, DRDO, AICTE, MOEF, DBT, ICSSR, NBHM, UNICEF, RUSA, etc. More than 40 MoU's have been signed with reputed International Universities for the collaborative research. Faculty members of the university have already established linkages with researchers working in world ranking universities/ institutes. DST sponsored International Joint collaborative research projects with the countries like Japan, South Korea and Egypt have been undertaken by the faculty members of the University. University has sanctioned EDUREFORM Project entitled "Mitigate the impact of fourth Industrial Revolution on Indian society: Education reforms for future and In - Service Teachers" co-funded by Erasmus + Program of the European Union. The University has scholarly publications as revealed from standard databases are 7474 and 77240 citations with h-index 132. It ranks first amongst Indian Universities in research output in Material Science. In Shivaji University, IT has appeared in all the walks of academic as well as administrative spheres. IT services like Web surfing, website, webmail, online web applications etc. are extensively used by 4000+ users on the campus. Shivaji University is contributing through various activities in Sustainable Development Goals (SDG-s). As a part of this initiative University has taken has taken substantial efforts in rain water harvesting. Two water storage tanks on the campus have been constructed for this purpose. The water harvesting is made through construction of watersheds. This has made the campus self-reliant for water. Also University is taking care of recycling of used water. Shivaji University has consistently focused on the excellence of education, research and student centric approach. It has produced eminent alumni who are contributing not only at National level but internationally, also.
