

COMPLIANCE REPROT

PROCEDURE:

The Second Cycle Peer Team Report was considered by the IQAC and it was placed before the Heads of the Departments.

The criterion wise sub committees were formed to prepare the strategies for the compliance of the recommendations made by the Peer Team.

DETAILS OF COMPLIANCE:
