Prof. (Dr.) R. K. Kamat, Director, IQAC welcomed all the Members of the IQAC.

Item No. 1: Confirmation of the minutes of the last meeting held on 27 March, 2019.

RESOLVED that the minutes of the IQAC meeting held on  $27^{\rm th}$  March, 2019 were read and confirmed.

Item No. 2: Regarding department NAAC Co-ordinator qualifying the ISO Auditor.

ISO 9001 family of standards is related to quality management systems and designed to help organizations meet and exceed their customer's requirements for quality products. This is the essence of quality goals and objectives of Shivaji University, Kolhapur.

The process of ISO certification of ShivajiUniversity was started few months back by the IQAC. An internal auditor per department was identified for the said purpose. The training and evaluation for the ISO auditor was conducted in the month of May 2019.

Professor Kamat shared with the IQAC that 56number of internal auditors were trained, out of which 37 cleared the evaluation. IQAC noted the achievement and placed on record appreciation as this is an indication of workforce professionalism that made this accomplishment possible.

Item No. 3. The follow-up action regarding ISO 9001-2015 certification Audit.

ISO 9001:2015 is a widely used standard for quality certification and also one of the most stringent. This standard ensures that every aspect of functioning of the organization is well-run and continually improving, including key processes, management roles and responsibilities, documentation, customer satisfaction, employee training, vendor performance and internal audits.

IQAC of Shivajj University has already initiated this process. The last step in obtaining certification is the Certification Audit, which usually happens in two stages: Stage 1 and 2. Stage 1, the preliminary audit, is used to gain knowledge of ainstitute's policies, objectives, risks, and processes.

Common activities performed during a Stage 1 Audit are:

- Documentation review. The auditor reviews institute's documentation to establish whether it is in line with the requirements of the standard.
- Location evaluation. The auditor will review the institute location to ensure that resources are properly allocated for the Stage 2 audit.
- Employee interviews. The auditor will interview employees to evaluate the effectiveness of and assess conformity to documented Procedures and Work Instructions, and ensure that they understand the standard requirements. The auditor

will also use these interviews to determine the preparedness of the company for the Stage 2 audit.

- Audit planning. The auditor will provide a focus for planning the stage 2 audit by gaining a sufficient understanding of the company's management system and operations. The auditor will also determine what resources are needed and confirm the date of the Stage 2 audit.
- Continuous improvement. The auditor will point out any areas
  of nonconformity and potential improvements of the
  management system. By including it in their audit report, the
  company has an opportunity to rectify the identified
  deficiencies prior to the Stage 2 audit.

It was resolved that the stage 1 audit will be conducted on August 14, 2019 while stage 2 audit will be planned during August 29-30, 2019. The detailed report regarding the audit compliance will be presented in the forthcoming meeting of the IQAC. It was also resolved that the following core committee will coordinate the ISO audit:

IQAC has initiated the process of course files for quite a some time. Ideal course file contents were shared with the members:

- All Course File contents must have a date and author.
- 2. Lecture hours, lab hours, credit hours, and office hours.
- 2. Detailed week-by-week plan for the entire semester that shows:
  - a. Topics to be covered each week
  - Schedule of assessments (homework, midter as, projects, quizzes, and/or final exam)
- 4. List of textbooks used, and for each textbook indicate whether it is:
  - a. Required
  - b. Recommended (world be useful to student)
  - c. Reference books

- Details of teaching resources on MOODLE (notes, handouts, drawings, slides, etc.)
- Print of all assessment materials (exams, quizzes, homework, etc.)
- 7. For each assessment:
  - a. Sample of best student answer (photocopy, or printed scan)
  - b. Sample of average student answer (photocopy, or printed scan)
  - Sample of worst student answer (photocopy, or printed scan)
  - Full record of all results for all assessments (print from Excel or similar)
- 10. All Course File contents must have a date and author.

#### It was resolved that:

- The faculty members will be given freedom for modifying the course files so as to suit their subject requirements.
- · The said course files will be assessed during AAA.
- From the academic year 2019-20, zip versions of the files will be sent to IQAC by the concerned faculty member.

### Item No. 5: AAA and role of department NAAC co-ordinator therein.

IQAC has nominated NAAC Coordinator per department. The role of the Department NAAC Coordinators is as follows:

- · bearing the delegated responsibilities of Director, IQAC.
- coordinating the dissemination of information on various quality parameters of higher education for NAAC/NIRF/QS/THE processes.
- coordinating the documentation of the various programmes / activities leading to quality improvement
- · steering the quality-related activities of the institution
- coordinating with IQAC in preparation of the Annual Quality Assurance Report (AQAR) to be submitted to NAAC based on the quality parameters.
- synchronizing the timely and efficient execution of the decisions of IQAC committee.

In view of the above, it was resoled that the process of the AAA per department will be steered by the Department NAAC Coordinator.

#### Item No. 6: Initiatives regarding slow/advanced learners.

Prof. (Mrs.) BharatiPatil shared the details of the Psychometric tests designed for categorizing the slow/advanced learners. She presented the details of the psychometric tests for measuringstudents' mental capabilities and behavioural style. IQAC noted the usefulness of the test to identify the hidden aspects of the students that are difficult to extract from a face-to-face interaction.

#### Item No. 7: Employability skills Assessment for advanced learners.

Teaching of learners with diverse needs can be a challenge in an academic environment. Inclusive education policy requires academic system to be able to cater for diversity of the students.

IQAC proposed to implement 'Employability Skills Assessment' for the advanced learners. Employability skills are sometimes called soft skills, foundational skills, work-readiness skills, or job-readiness skills allows the students to:

- communicate with coworkers
- solve problems
- understand their role within the team
- · make responsible choices, and
- · take charge of their own career

The said assessment will be carried out through the coordination with Brain berg Knowledge Services LLP which is working with NITI Aayog. IQAC coordinated a pilot survey regarding the same for the Department of Education of our University. The sample reports were shared with the members.

It was rescived to conduct the Employability Skills Assessment for advanced learners in coordination with the Brain berg Knowledge Services LLP

### Item No. 8: Proposal of Kaushalya Finishing School for soft skill development programme received from Kaushalya Finishing School, Kolhapur.

One of the IQAC members, Mrs. PallaviKorgaonkar presented the proposal for extending the services of Kaushalya Finishing School for improving the interpersonal skills, collaboration and teamwork, logic

skills, critical thinking and decision making and communication skills listening and speaking for the students of the Shivaji University, Kolhapur under the corporate social responsibility of the Koragaonkar trust. Prof. (Dr.) R. K. Kamat, Director, IQAC welcomed all the new Members of the IQAC.

Following business was transacted.

Item No. 01: Confirmation of the minutes of the last meeting held on 25th April, 2018.

RESOLVED that the minutes of the IQAC meeting held on 25<sup>th</sup> April, 2018 were read and confirmed.

Item No. 02: Induction to IQAC members regarding roles and responsibilities.

Prof. R.K. Kamat elaborated the role and responsibly of the IQAC in internationalization of the quality assurance for the benefit of the new members especially the external members coming from industries. He stressed on the role of IQAC to develop a system for conscious, consistent and catalytic action to improve the academic and administrative performance of the institution. It was also made clear that that the IQAC should promote measures for institutional functioning towards quality enhancement through internalization of quality culture and institutionalization of best practices.

Item No. 03: Issuing advisory to Board of Studies (BoS) regarding relevance of curricula with reference to local, national and global needs.

A quality curricula has essential role in the provision of quality learning for the young learners as well in articulating and supporting the higher education that is relevant to their holistic development. Board of Studies (BoS) has a greater role to play in formulating such a curriculum.

In light of above the IQAC members had brainstorming as regards to improving the BoS functioning in making the curricula inclusive, thus playing a significant role in ensuring that it is equitable and articulates the competencies necessary for employability, lifelong learning and holistic development.

It was resolved to send the advisory note to all the Board of Studies on the following lines:

"Board of Studies (BoS) at and Academic Council (AC) of the University are the most vital academic bodies and are showcasing visibly functional, through the members on board with requisite professional experience. As per the new NAAC guidelines it is required to set right the process ensuing cognizance of feedback from student, parents, teachers (other than the BoS members) and employers so that the curriculum will be inclusive of the desires of all

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the stakeholders. One of the most striking features of the curriculum should be linking of the courses in line with various initiatives of Government of India. Some of the examples of the same are associating 'Environmental Studies' with the 'National River Conservation Plan' and 'Professional Ethics and Human Values' with 'National Anticorruption Strategy'. Integration of such national priorities and goals in the curriculum will deliver a framework which is helpful in cultivating future generation of students with awareness of the issues and challenges in the forefront of the society. In addition to above the curricula should also focus on issues with reference to local, national and global needs."

Item No. 04: Recommending all BoS Chairpersons to focus on cross cutting issues in curriculum.

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RESOLVED that the BoS Chairpersons should be communicated that the Curriculum be enriched by inclusion of value-based courses — Gender Sensitization, Environmental Studies, Professional Ethics and Human Values, Soft Skills and Personality Development, Entrepreneurship Development, Life Skills, English Communication Skills. Swayam — NPTEL should be given due diligence. Project work, field surveys and experiential learning type courses should be given emphasis. Feedback received from the stake holders be analyzed and appropriately incorporated into curriculum. Few courses —Internet of Things, robotics be introduced into curriculum as value added courses based on feedback provided by stakeholders.

Item No. 05: Formulating Teaching-Learning task force for reviewing student centric methods.

It was resolved that appropriate steps for diagnosing student learning levels should be made more effective. It was informed that suitable measures are being taken to cater the needs of slow learners by conducting remedial, bridge courses. Students are provided special coaching to bridge the gap in English communication, soft skills, Mathematics, Programming. Student centric teaching methodologies like Think Pair Share are helping in supporting students with slow learning issues. Advanced learners are involved in research projects and are encouraged to take additional courses offered by NPTEL. Most of the Departments are encouraging the students to perform course-based projects, internships, mini and major projects.

Prof. M.S. Deshmukh presented a methodology to categorize the slow and advanced learners for the students other than Science & Technology faculty. The same was appreciated by all the members.

In order to make teaching learning more effective, it was resolved to formulate a task force comprising of following:

The above task force will divide the on campus departments amongst themselves and mentor them regarding the teaching-learning methods.

Item No. 06: Reforms in internal Examinations.

RESOLVED that each department Chairman of Examinations should ensure smooth conduction of internal examinations. The results of each test are should be strictly declared within a week of the conclusion of the test. The students should be shown their respective answer sheets and discuss their queries with concerned faculty member. The term work evaluation should be done by respective course teachers in the mid and at the end of semester. Reforms such as open book test, question bank generation, blending of various types of questions as per Bloom's taxonomy should be introduced so as to give justice to student's varied capabilities. It was resolved that the same will be communicated to all the departments through Director, Board of Examination and Evaluation.

Item No. 07: Presentation of DSD on extension activities in the neighborhood community.

The item was postponed since DSD couldn't attend the meeting due to official assignment.

Item No. 08: Presentation by Dr. K. S. Oza on review of learning outcomes.

# Report on SWAYAM Implementation

# 1. Executive Summary

Shivaji University, Kolhapur (SUK) has structured and started an appropriate arrangement to execute SWAYAM in various UG/PG departments of the University. While implementing the SWAYAM it is important to pursue a well-planned strategy for execution of SWAYAM. To create awareness about SWAYAM-MOOCs the workshop has been conducted for faculties and students. We are disseminating the information about SWAYAM through WhatsApp and emails. A webpage containing all relevant information about SWAYAM, have been provided at SUK website. To coordinate the implementation of SWAYAM smoothly in SUK, the authorities of the University appointed a coordinator of SWAYAM, SWAYAM Mentors, Exam Coordinator and also constituted various committees to look in different matters of SWAYAM. Coordinator and Mentors of SWAYAM work as a troubleshooter for any problem encountered by the learner. Approval by BOS has been taken for various SWAYAM-MOOCs to offer at various UG/PG departments of SUK. For the self-finance supported departments, it is decided by the authorities to pay the SWAYAM examination fee from the tuition fee of the students. In the next phase, we are planning to implement the SWAYAM at affiliated colleges of SUK.

# 2. Preample

With a view to providing access to the best quality learning resources across the country, the project SWAYAM (Study Webs of Active Learning for Young Aspiring Minds) has been started by Government of India.

'SWAYAM platform' is an IT platform developed and made functional by the Ministry of Human Resource Development of Government of India for the purpose of offering Massive Open Online Courses (MOOCs).

MOOCs are such online courses which are developed; following the four quadrants approach: e-Tutorial; e-Content; Discussion forum and Assessment, and made available on the SWAYAM platform of Government of India.



- SWAYAM announces the courses every semester in advance to enable Universities to choose the best courses for their students in the coming semester
- SWAYAM notify all the Institutions, on 1st June and 1st November every year, the list of the online learning courses going to be offered in the forthcoming Semester.
- Students can take any number of courses, but credit transfer only up to 20 % of the total credit of the subject/ program.

Government of India issued a policy regarding transfer of credits earned by a student through MOOCs on SWAYAM

# 3. Awareness program

University Grants Commission in its efforts to take the SWAYAM initiative forward and encourage more and more Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) to adopt the MOOCs on SWAYAM, organized one day orientation workshop on "Roles and Responsibilities of the University and its SWAYAM Coordinators" for SWAYAM Coordinators of Universities on 2nd February, 2018, at AICTE, New Delhi. As per the directives were given by the University authority Dr. K. D. Kucche, SWAYAM Coordinator, have participated in this workshop.

The orientation workshop was inaugurated by Prof. Dhirendra Pal Singh, Chairman, University Grants Commission, in the august presence of Prof Anil D Sahasrabudhe, Chairman, AICTE, New Delhi, Dr. Jagdish Arora, Director, INFLIBNET Centre, Ahmedabad, Dr. J B Nadda, Director, CEC, New Delhi and Dr (Mrs) Pankaj Mittal, Additional Secretary, UGC. In her welcome address Dr (Mrs) Pankaj Mittal, Additional Secretary, UGC, gave a brief overview of SWAYAM and MOOCs. The following road map was suggested to the SWAYAM Coordinators to increase the reach of SWAYAM Course:



- Nominate University SWAYAM Mentors to popularize the SWAYAM and SWAYAM Prabha initiative among students and faculties of colleges.
- Conduct Awareness workshops in their University by inviting all affiliated Colleges and their students.
- Provide the important links related to SWAYAM, UGC-MOOCS, SWAYAM Prabha, Inflibnet on the website of University.
- ❖ Provide the SWAYAM workshop participation certificate to participants
- Promote the of SWAYAM and SWAYAM Prabha through the Social networking sites

Following the guidelines given in the orientation workshop, to create the awareness among all the teaching faculty of the University about UGC-SWAYAM and MOOCs, Shivaji University has organized one day workshop on the UGC-SWAYAM and MOOCs, dated 22nd May 2018. The workshop was inaugurated and chaired by Prof. D. T. Shirke, Hon'ble Pro-Vice-Chancellor in the august presence of Deans of all Faculties. The workshop was Co-ordinated by Dr. K. D. Kucche, Coordinator, SWAYAM.

Two eminent resource persons, Prof. Dhaneswar Harichandan and Mr. Mandar Bhanushe from Institute of Distance and Open Learning, Mumbai University, were called as resource person of this workshop. Participation certificate has been provided to each participant of this SWAYAM workshop.




Photo: Inaugural Address by Prof. D. T. Shirke, Hon'ble Pro-Vice-Chancellor.



# 4. Mentoring

For the effective implementation of the SWAYAM at Shivaji University Kolhapur, SWAYAM Coordinator and the University SWAYAM Mentors under the guidance of the University authority are working with the following objectives:

- To popularize the SWAYAM MOOCs among the students through power point presentation.
- Facilitate the students in enrolling for the selected MOOCs.
- Work as a troubleshooter for any problem encountered by any learner
- > Providing assistance in writing, submitting assignments and to appear for term end final examination.
- Monitor the progress of students who have registered on SWAYAM Platform









#### 5. Governance

In order coordinate the implementation of SWAYAM effectively at the UG / PG Departments / School / Centers of Shivaji University, Kolhapur, the University authority have appointed Dr. K. D. Kucche as a Coordinator for SWAYAM (Please see **Annexure-I**).

To disseminate and popularize the SWAYAM courses among the students of the University and its affiliated colleges and to facilitate registration and completion of SWAYAM courses, Shivaji University authority have appointed Six University SWAYAM Mentors from various faculties (Please See Annexure-II).

Further, one faculty member from each department is designated as a Facilitator for the MOOCs selected to guide the students throughout the course and to facilitate /conduct the Lab/Practical sessions/Examinations.

To look in to the matter related to SWAYAM regulations, adaptation of MOOCs, examination of SWAYAM-MOOCs and credit transfer of MOOCs through SWAYAM, the standing committee has been constituted (Please See Annexure-III). Hon'ble Pro-Vice-Chancellor is the Chairman of this committee. Deans of all faculties, Two Professors and SWAYAM Coordinator are the members of the standing committee for SWAYAM.

Further, Shivaji University authority in its efforts to take the SWAYAM initiative forward and encourage colleges affiliated to Shivaji University to adopt the MOOCs through SWAYAM courses on SWAYAM, have constituted a committee of seven members whose members are Principals, Academic Council Members, Senior Professors and Dy. Registrar of BOS section (Please See Annexure: IV).

To encourage more and more students across the UG/PG Departments/Schools/Centres of the Shivaji University, the University authorities have taken number of major steps which are specified above. Further, for self-finance supported departments it is decided by the authorities to pay the SWAYAM examination fee from the tuition fee of the students (Please See Annexure: V).



## 6. Courses offered

The University authority decided that each Department/School/Centers should choose at least one of the MOOCs through SWAYAM platform to offer for the students of odd semester (excluding first semester) in the UG/ PG Departments of University.

For the semester commencing from July 2018, the authorities have selected 66 SWAYAM-MOOCs to offer at various UG/ PG Departments of University

For these selected 66 SWAYAM-MOOCs the approval has been taken from the Board of Study (Please See **Annexure: VI**).

As per the record received from the various UG/PG departments of our University 1054 students have been enrolled for SWAYAM courses for July, 2018 semester (Please See **Annexure-VII**).

For the semester commencing from July 2019, the University authorities have selected 33 SWAYAM-MOOCs to offer at various UG/ PG Departments of University. The approval to these courses has been taken from the Board of Study (Please See **Annexure: VIII**).

The process of enrollment of the students in the various UG/PG departments for the MOOCs selected is in progress.

# 7. Difficulties in the implemenation of SWAYAM

We have communicated to UGC few problems faced while implementing SWAYAM at PG level (Please See Annexure: IX). Which are as below:

The examination fee for each course is Rs. 1000/- for general candidates and Rs. 500/- for SC/ST/OBC/ PwD and women candidates". Total examination fees being charged by our University for all the courses (4 to 5 courses) for any semester is below Rs. 500/-. Therefore students who have registered for the SWAYAM courses and those who do not afford to pay these fees are



not appearing for the examination. Charging fee for SWAYAM examination is currently the biggest block for the promotion of the SWAYAM. Therefore we are requesting you to waive the examination fees for the SWAYAM courses.

- Another issue in conduct of SWAYAM examination is that, the period during which SWAYAM examinations are scheduled by the concerned coordinators is overlapping with our University term end Examinations. It is difficult to accommodate SWAYAM course examinations within our term end examinations time table.
- Further, allot the examination center to Shivaji University Kolhapur for SWAYAM Examination (Online as well as Pen Paper Examination), so that it will be easy for the students of Shivaji University and its affiliated colleges to appear for the SWAYAM Examinations.

In the response to our letter, UGC have included Kolhapur as examination center for the pen & paper examination of SWAYAM from January 2019. **University authority have appointed** Mr. Gajanan Ramakant Palse,, Deputy Registrar ( Pre - Exam ) as Centre Coordinator for SWAYAM examination and same is communicated to the e-content team of UGC.

# 8. Future plans

From the academic year 2019-20, University authority has introduced mandatory Non-CGPA Elective Course related to UGC SWAYAM-MOOCs in Semester -III. The qualified candidates shall obtain the credits as specified on UGC SWAYAM-MOOCs portal. The candidates who do not qualify the UGC SWAYAM-MOOCs examination have to qualify the internal written examination of equivalent credits conducted by the respective department.

The process of credit transfer as per the UGC regulations 2016 is under consideration and will be implemented after the approval of various academic bodies.



# 9. Advantages

- 1. SWAYAM-MOOCs are helpful to all to those students who don't want to take only formal degree, but want to earn the degree with additional Knowledge and Certificate.
- 2. Student can earn certifications and knowledge of any courses.
- 3. Students can take any number of courses, but credit transfer only up to 20 % of the total credit of the subject/ program.
- 4. The project SWAYAM is helping the students and teachers to update their knowledge and skills.
- 5. The project SWAYAM is helping to study the students located in rural / backward / remote areas. They can access the material on the course prepared by best teacher in India at any time anywhere with having internet facility.
- 6. SWAYAM is an instrument for self-actualization providing opportunities for a life-long learning.
- 7. SWAYAM create synergies between the salient features of anytimeanywhere format of e-Learning and the traditional classroom-based chalk and talk method.

Reports of RUSA, Maharashtra sponsored Three Days Workshop on, "Faculty Development workshop on NAAC: Revised accreditation Framework (RAF) for Principals/IQAC Coordinators of Affiliated Colleges", organized by Internal Quality Assurance Cell, Shivaji University, Kolhapur, 8<sup>th</sup> May 2019 to 10<sup>th</sup> May 2019

Internal Quality Assurance Cell, Shivaji University, Kolhapur organized a RUSA, Maharashtra sponsored Three Days Workshop on, "Faculty Development workshop on NAAC: Revised Accreditation Framework (RAF) for Principals/IQAC Coordinators of Affiliated College", during 8<sup>th</sup> May 2019 to 10<sup>th</sup> May 2019. The objective of the workshop was too aware the academicians to on NAAC: Revised Accreditation Framework (RAF) for grading the institutions.

The Inaugural Session was conducted by Dr. R.K. Kamat, Director, Internal Quality Assurance Cell, Shivaji University, Kolhapur and began with a welcome address from Prof. (Dr.) Devanand B. Shinde, Hon'ble Vice Chancellor, Shivaji University, Kolhapur. He greeted all members and expressed his appreciation to RUSA for sponsoring the same. Prof. (Dr.) D.T. Shirke, Hon'ble Pro Vice Chancellor, Shivaji University, Kolhapur was Guest of Honor to the workshop. He mentioned about the initiatives taken by Shivaji University for colleges under University to apply for NAAC assessment. Another Guest of Honors Dr. Pramod Lakhe, Joint Director, Rashtriya Uchchatar Shiksha Abhiyan,(RUSA) Maharashtra and Dr. P.N. Pabrekar, Consultant, Rashtriya Uchchatar Shiksha Abhiyan,(RUSA) Maharashtra emphasised the importance to have NAAC accreditation, as it is a necessity to acquire funds from all funding agencies like RUSA, UGC and others.

1st session after inauguration of Dr. Vani Laturkar from Nanded has opened keynote on topic Critical Differences in the revised NAAC Accreditation Framework and DVV, Criterion-1: Overview of Curriculum Aspects. She addressed notes with NAAC revised accreditation framework which became operational in July 2017. She said that revised framework is ICT enabled, objective, transparent, scalable and robust. She emphasizes the efforts taken by NAAC to remain relevant and globally acceptable. National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) has taken cognizance of the changing trends in higher education, stakeholder perceptions and feedback, besides the avalanche of experience gained from its accreditation



exercise involving more than 11,132 institutions [518 Universities and 10614 Colleges] till July 2017, which stand in good stead in all its endeavors, said the statement. She has thrown light on Criterion-1: Overview of Curriculum Aspects. She said that over the last few months, NAAC has conducted several rounds of stakeholder interactions, a National Workshop and Meetings of several Working Groups for the preparation of the Manuals for Universities, Autonomous Colleges and Affiliated Colleges.

In the afternoon 2<sup>nd</sup> Session delivered by **Dr. Vani Laturkar** on Criterion-6: Governance, Leadership and Management; Preparing for the Peer Team Visit. She convey the New Framework which is a subtle combination of System Generated Scores (SGS) with a combination of online evaluation (70%) and Peer evaluation (30%) which would usher in high level of transparency. Also she expressed her views on ICT intensive and 'outcome based education.

She mentioned that NAAC has played a vital role in the growth of the institutions and individuals across the nation. She told the participants that in the revised framework, the number of Peer Team members and duration of visit has been reduced. She also cited many examples how any false information mentioned by the college in SSR is revealed by the Peer Team. She, cautioned, that such practice is not acceptable and the college should always submit only that information which could be verified. She also made it clear that the Peer Team is not for grievance redressal, therefore, the faculty, employees and students during interaction with Peer Team should put forth answers honestly and desist from forwarding their personal

**Dr. Chandrakant Rawal**, delivered a 3<sup>rd</sup> session on Criterion-3: Research, Innovation and Extension as well as Criterion-5: Student Support and Progression. Dr. Rawal in his address laid emphasis on Criteria 3 as well as Criterion 5 of the NAAC assessment. After his brief deliberation, he interacted with the participants and discussed various issues of concern related to NAAC accreditation. He focused on Quality Indicator Framework (QIF) consist of seven criteria which represent core function and activity of Higher Education Institutes and key Indicators. He discussed and explained the Qualitative Metrics and Quantitative metrics parameters, and its weightage. He highlighted on main QIF especially Research and Innovation. He highlighted the importance of Criterion V. He said that institution have to provide necessary assistance to students, to enable them to acquire meaningful experiences for learning at the campus and to



facilitate their holistic development and progression. He also mentioned that institute also looks into student performance and alumni profiles and the progression of students to higher education and gainful employment.

He then took over the session 4 in the afternoon and explained the details of Criterion-7: Institutional Values and Best Practices Briefing on Incubation Centre He has thrown light on 7 criteria and quantitative metrics of affiliated colleges. He has enlightened on how to prepare students for the student satisfaction survey. He said that through the A&A process the institutions should do something which makes them grow. In course of his dynamic presentation, he flagged certain important points which the institutions should focus upon. Those points are NAAC framework for assessment and accreditation is unique to any other country and the assessment is based on Global Good Practices and Norms. Quality Assurance is a must and therefore quality assessment is to be accepted as a pleasant and productive challenge. IQAC should be empowered to take necessary action and bring a change for the better. Since Best Practice can significantly contribute to the development of the institution, identifying Best Practice is the need of institution. He also mentioned the importance of Incubation centre.

The third and concluding day started with **Dr. Bharat Kangude**, detailed session on Documentation and E-Reports preparation, Repository and Retrieval. He majorly focused his views on Criterion-4: Infrastructure and Learning Resources and Criterion-2: Teaching Learning and Evaluation, Role of IQAC in Quality Enhancement.

He gave knowledge to the participants on how to show case infrastructure for NAAC assessment. He made the participants understand the concepts in Criterion 4. He expressed his views on adequacy and optimal uses of the facilities available in an institution are essential to maintain the quality of academic and other programmes on the campus. He also mentioned that it is require knowing about information on how every constituent of the institution - students, teachers and staff - benefit from these facilities. He emphasizes on Automation of library using the ILMS, use of e-journals and books, providing remote access to e-resources in the library. He said that providing for these and such other developments as well as utilizing them well are important indicators of the quality of an academic institution.

There was also an interactive session during which participants raised their queries relating to NAAC accreditation process, which to a large extent were answered.




Workshop on Campus for Departments & Affiliated Colleges for Technology Commercialization & Incubation Centre: Incubation Ignition Program - 21.01.2019
