EXAMINATIONS IN THE FACULTY OF ENGINEERING

Ordinances and Regulations

(Re-Structured Four Year Courses)

O.E. 1 : No Candidate shall be admitted to the course leading to Degree of Bachelor of Engineering unless :-

He has passed the Higher Secondary Certificate (Standard XII) Examination of the Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education, Pune or its equivalent examination with English, Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics and with not less than 50 percent marks (45 percent marks for Backward Class Candidates from Maharashtra State only) in the subjects of Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics taken together at one and the same sitting.

OR

He has passed the Indian School Certificate (Standard XII) Examination or any other equivalent Higher Secondary (Standard XII) Examination of a Council or Board outside Maharashtra State with English, Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics and with not less than 50 percent marks (45 percent marks for Backward class candidates from Maharashtra State only) in the subjects of Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics taken together at one and the same sitting.

O.E. 2 : A candidate, to be eligible for a Degree will be required to pass examinations, as under :-

First examination in Engineering	Part-I & Part-II for partwise courses and I Year for Yearly Courses.
Second examination in Engineering	Part-I & Part-II for partwise courses and II Year for Yearly Courses.
Third examination in Engineering	Part-I & Part-II for partwise courses and III Year for Yearly Courses.
B. E.	Part-I & Part-II for partwise courses and IV Year for Yearly Courses.

O.E. 3 : No candidate will be admitted to any examination unless he keep terms at a College affiliated to the University, and produces, from the Principal of the College, testimonials of :

- Satisfactory attendance at the theory, practical and term work classes as prescribed.
- Satisfactory completion of the term-work prescribed for the Part and passing in the term-work by securing atleast 40% marks out of the maximum prescribed for the entire term-work.

O.E. 4 :

- A candidate who fails at his F. E. Part-I Examination, will be allowed to keep term for his F. E. Part-II Examination, for partwise courses.

CIRCULAR.

It is hereby notified for the information of all concerned that the following OME 12 of the Master of Engineering under the Faculty of Engineering and Technology was sent to the Hon. Chancellor as provided under Section 54 (4) of the Maharashtra Universities Act 1994 on 15-2-2002. The Hon. Chancellor has not raised any objections to this Ordinance hence the following amended Ordinance is implemented which is passed by the Management Council in its meeting held on 5-2-2002.

OME-12

- a) Any person who has passed the Degree of Bachelor of Engineering of this University or a degree of another University as equivalent thereto is eligible for admission to the appropriate M.E. Course by papers and Dissertation.
- b) A Candidate who has passed M.Sc. (Organic Chemistry, M.Sc. Bio-Chemistry, M.Sc. Micro Biology) in First Class from this University or an equivalent examination from any other University will be eligible for admission to the M.E. (Civil) Environmental Engineering course after he keeps two terms for subjects prescribed for him by the Board of Studies in Civil Engineering and passes in these subjects.
- c) Candidate who has passed the Grade-Institution of Electronics and Telecommunication Engineering Examination is eligible for admission to M.E. (Electrical) (Control System) if he has passed GATE (Graduate Aptitude Test in Engineering) Examination successfully and has studied the following courses during their studies leading to Grade IETE (Institution of Electronic and Telecommunication Engineering).
 - 1) Electrical Machines
 - 2) Numerical Analysis
 - 3) Control System.
- d) The Diploma holders after passing their Sections A and B examinations of Institution of Engineering (India) Calcutta are considered eligible for admission to M.E. degree course in the respective branch only when they qualify through the GATE Examination.
- e) A candidate who has passed B.E. (Automobile) Engineering B.E. (Production) Engineering Course is considered eligible for admission to the M.E. (Mechanical) Degree Course.
- f) A candidate who has passed Final year in any of the following discipline of Engineering Degree Course with Minimum 50% of aggregate marks is considered eligible for admission to M.E. Computer Science and Engineering Degree Course.
 - a) B.E. (Computer Science & Engineering)
 - b) B.E. (Computer Engg. Computer Tech.)
 - c) B.E. (Electrical/Electronics Engineering)
 - d) B.E. (Electronics and Telecommunication Engineering)
 - e) B.E. (Instrumentation Engineering)
 - f) B.E. (Information Technology)
 - g) B.E. (Industrial Electronics)

The Candidate with GATE Score in Computer Science and Engineering will be given preference.

The NON-GATE candidates will have to appear for Entrance Test and Interview.

g)(I) Any Engineering graduate who has completed at least one subject i.e. Control System at under graduate level is eligible for the admission to M.E. Electrical (Control System) Degree Course.


(II) Any Engineering graduate who has completed at least two Subjects of (1) Electrical Machine (2) Electrical Power System/Engineering at Third and Final Year B.E. Course is eligible for the admission to M.E. Electrical (Power System) Degree Course.

The candidate with GATE Score in Electrical Engineering will be given preference.

The Non-GATE candidates will have to appear for the Entrance Test and Interview

h) A Candidate who has completed B.E./ B.Tech. Degree in Industrial Engineering and Production Industrial Engineering is eligible for admission to M.E. Mechanical (Production Engineering) Degree Course.

ORDINANCES

O. M. E. 12 :

- a) Any person who has passed the Degree of Bachelor of Engineering of this University or a degree of another University as equivalent thereto is eligible for admission to the appropriate M. E. Course by papers and Dissertation.
- b) A candidate who has passed M. Sc. (Organic Chemistry/M. Sc. Bio-Chemistry/M. Sc. Micro-biology) in First Class from this University or an equivalent examination from any other University will be eligible for admission to the M. E. (Civil) Environmental Engineering course after he keeps two terms for subjects prescribed from him by the Board of Studies in Civil Engineering and passes in these subjects.
- c) Candidate who has passed the Grade-Institution of Electronic and Telecommunication Engineering Examination is eligible for admission to M. E. (Electrical) (Control System) if he has passed GATE (Graduate Aptitude Test in Engineering) Examination successfully and has studied, the following courses during their studies leading to Grade IETE (Institution of Electronics and Telecommunication Engineering).
 - 1) Electrical Machines
 - 2) Numerical Analysis
 - 3) Control System.
- d) The Diploma holders after passing their Sections A and B examinations of Institution of Engineering (India) Calcutta are considered eligible for admission to M. E. degree course in the respective branch only when they qualify through the Gate Examination.
- e) A candidate who have passed B. E. (Automobile) Engineering B. E. (Production) Engineering Course is considered eligible for admission to the M. E. (Mechanical) Degree Course.

O. M. E. 13 : A candidate, to be eligible for the Master's Degree by Papers and Dissertations, shall pass the following examinations :

M. E. First Semester Examination.

M. E. Second Semester Examination.

M. E. Third Semester Examination.

O. M. E. 14 : No candidate will be admitted to the M. E. First or Second or Third Semester Examination unless he keeps terms in which the subjects prescribed for that Semester are taught at a College, affiliated to the University, and produces from the Principal of the College, testimonials of :

- a) Satisfactory attendance at the Theory, Practical, Tutorial and Sessional Work Classes, as prescribed,

(ii)

- b) Completion of atleast 75 percent of the Sessional Work if any, prescribed for the Semester by securing atleast 50% marks prescribed for the same.

O. M. E. 15 : No candidate will be examined for M. E. Third Semester Dissertation examination unless he keeps a term for his Dissertation at a College affiliated to the University and passes in all the Course work prescribed with 50% aggregate marks, taken together.

O. M. E. 16 : A candidate registered for M. E. Course must pass his M. E. Examination within five years from the date of registration.

O. M. E. 17 : A term will comprise of about four calendar months as under :-

First Term : 15th July to 15th November of the same year.

Second Term : 1st January to 30th April of the same year.

O. M. E. 18 : M. E. First, Second and Third Semester Examinations will be held twice a year i. e. in December and May. Third Semester Examination for Dissertation alone will be held after fulfilling the requirements of O. M. E. 15.

O. M. E. 19 : A candidate can appear at the end of the First Semester for M. E. First Semester Examinations.

At the end of the Second Semester for M. E. Second Semester Examination or M. E. First and or Second Semester Examinations.

At the end of the Third Semester for M. E. Third Semester Examination and or any of the previous Semester Examinations.

Third Semester Examination for Dissertation is as per the requirements of O. M. E. 15.

Regulations

R. M. E. 1 : The Examination scheme for M. E. Courses in different branches shall be according to tables 1 to 12 and the Syllabi prescribed, therefore, shall be subject to such revision, modification etc. as may be made by the Academic Council from time to time on the recommendation of the Boards of Studies under the Faculty.

R. M. E. 2 : At each Semester Examination

- 1) Paper Total,
- 2) Sessional Work,
- 3) Seminar,
- 4) Dissertation and Oral taken together.

Wherever prescribed, shall each constitute a separate head of passing.

"Aggregate" (total marks) at M. E. First, Second and Third Semester Examinations taken together and also Dissertation Examination will each constitute a separate 'head of passing.'

Sessional Works

R. M. E. 3 : There will be sessional work for each of the ten papers prescribed, Sessional Work may consist of Practical/Drawing/Exercises/Tutorials/other assignments as prescribed.

Sessional work will be assessed by the concerned subject teacher.

O.M.E. 12 : As it is - a) to h) - No change

O.M.E. 13 : A candidate, to be eligible for the award of Master's Degree by Papers and Dissertations, shall pass the following examinations:

- M.E. First Semester Examination.
- M.E. Second Semester Examination.
- M.E. Third Semester Examination.
- M.E. Fourth Semester Examination.

O.M.E. 14 : No candidate will be admitted to the M.E. First or Second, Third or Fourth Semester Examination unless he keeps terms in which the subjects prescribed for that Semester are taught at a College, affiliated to the University, and produces from the Principal of the College, testimonials of :

- a) Satisfactory attendance at the Theory, Practical, Tutorial and Sessional Work Classes, as prescribed,
- b) Completion of atleast 75 percent of the Sessional Work if any, prescribed for the Semester by securing atleast 50% marks prescribed for the same.

O.M.E. 15 : No candidate will be examined for M.E. Fourth Semester Dissertation examination unless he keeps a term for his Dissertation at a College affiliated to the University and passes in all the Course work prescribed with 50% aggregate marks, taken together.

O.M.E. 16 : As it is - No change

O.M.E. 17 : A term will comprise of about four calender months as declared by the University from time to time.

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O.M.E. 18 : M.E. First, Second, Third and Fourth Semester Examinations will be held twice a year i.e. in December and May. Fourth Semester Examination for Dissertation alone will be held after fulfilling the requirements of O.M.E. 15.

O.M.E. 19 : A candidate can appear at the end of the First Semester for M.E. First Semester Examinations.

At the end of the Second Semester for M.E. Second Semester Examination or M.E. First and or Second Semester Examinations.

At the end of the Third Semester for M.E. Third Semester Examination and or any of the previous Semester Examinations.

At the end of Fourth Semester for M.E. Fourth Semester examination or any previous Semester Examinations.

Fourth Semester Examination for Dissertation is as per the requirements of O.M.E. 15.

Regulations

R.M.E. 1 : The Examination scheme for M.E. Courses in different branches shall be according to structure and the Syllabi prescribed, for the course therefore, shall be subject to such revision, modification etc. as may be made by the Academic Council from time to time on the recommendation of the Boards of Studies under the Faculty.

O.E. 3 of Bachelor of Architecture Course



The candidate must produce necessary testimonials/ certificates as mentioned below duly signed by the Head of the Institution where he has kept terms.

- a) Satisfactory attendance i.e. 75% at the theory and practicals.
- b) Satisfactory completion of sessional work prescribed for the particular subject. (with minimum of 50% of marks for the Internal Assessment.) Failing to do so the candidate will be detained and will not be allowed to appear external and written examination
- c) Satisfactory completion of Journals/Portfolios etc.
- d) Has appeared for the midterm examination held by the Institute.
- e) deleted.
- f) External assessment of the Term work in concerned subjects in one year shall be conducted prior to the written examination of the particular year and marks. (External oral and Written Exam.) shall be declared together after the completion of the assessment of written examination.

O.105 : Verification of Marks
