CERTIFICATE COURSE IN PORTUGUESE Revised Syllabus (Semester Pattern)

General Information:

The *Certificate Course in PORTUGUESE A1* (Basic User I) is a course of **ONE** year duration with TWO SEMESTERS with the examination conducted at the end of every semester. Teaching Hours: 180

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Eligiomity:

The candidates who have passed H.S.C. (12thStd.) or an equivalent examination **OR** who have completed a Three-year Diploma Course after 10th Std. are eligible for admission to the *Certificate Course in Portuguese A1* (Basic User I).

Aims & Objectives:

- 1. This **Course** is compatible the CEF (Common European Framework of reference levels for languages: learning, teaching, assessment) and it is scaled at the broad **level A1** Basic User I (*Breakthrough*).
- 2. At this level the student:

Can understand and use familiar everyday expressions and very basic phrases aimed at the satisfaction of needs of a concrete type; can introduce him/herself and others and can ask and answer questions about personal details such as where he/she lives, people he/she knows and things he/she has; can interact in a simple way provided the other person talks slowly and clearly and is prepared to help.

3. This Course is divided in units, specifying the topics and grammar contents of the syllabus in each one, according to the planning of the teacher concerned who will conducted and assess also the continuous evaluation and the end examination.

The evaluation of *Certificate Course in Portuguese* shall consist of two components:

A. Internal Assessment based on Home Assignments. Marks 10

B. The **Semester Examination** at the Certificate Course in Portuguese will consist of two components:

a/ one WRITTEN paper of TWO hours duration with 40 marks and,

b/ one ORAL examination of 25 marks.

Total marks -75.

Standard of Passing:

To pass the Certificate Course Examination in Portuguese a candidate has to obtain at least 35% in written and oral examinations **separately**, but 40% in aggregate, and also a minimum of 40% in the Internal Assessment.

1st Class with distinction	75% or more in the aggregate of the written and oral examinations.
1st Class	60% or more but less than 75% in the aggregate of the written and oral examinations.
2nd Class	50% or more but less than 60% in the aggregate of the written and oral examinations.
Pass Class	40% or more but less than 50% in the aggregate of the written and oral examinations.

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
