Revised Syllabus (Semester Pattern)

General Information:

The **Diploma Course in Japanese** is a course of **ONE** year duration with TWO SEMESTERS with the examination conducted at the end of every semester. Teaching hours will be 280.

Eligibility:

The candidates who have passed certificate course in Japanese or JLPT N5 level conducted by Japan Foundation are eligible for admission to the **Diploma Course in Japanese.**

Aims & Objectives:

- 1. The Course is aimed at developing the listening, speaking, reading ,writing and grammar skills in the learners.
- 2. The learner must be able to translate texts from and into Japanese language, speak fluently in Japanese.
- 3. **Listening and speaking skill**: The students can express simple opinions, wishes/desires in familiar contexts.
- 4. **Reading skill**: The students acquire the necessary vocabulary with regard to life, profession, family, food, invitations etc.
- 5. **Writing skill**: The students acquire the knowledge to compose short texts using various prepositions, and to construct complex sentences.
- 1. **Conversational skill**: The students are able to converse with others on simple day to day situations

Standard of Passing:

To pass the Diploma Course Examination in Japanese, a candidate has to obtain at least 35% in written and oral examinations **separately**, but 40% in aggregate, and also a minimum of 40% in the Internal Assessment.

1st Class with distinction : 75% or more in the aggregate of the written and oral

examinations.

1st Class : 60% or more but less than 75% in the aggregate of

the written and oral examinations.

2nd Class : 50% or more but less than 60% in the aggregate of

the written and oral examinations.

Pass Class : 40% or more but less than 50% in the aggregate of

the written and oral examinations.

Note: The other rules and regulations relating to Eligibility, TC/MC, **Standard of passing** etc. will be same as the Department has laid down for Russian at the Ad.hoc BOS in Foreign languages from time to time

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Note: The candidate, who has filled the examination form, but either does not appear for the said examination OR fails in any paper/ papers, will have to reappear for all papers of that course in the next immediately following examination only. Otherwise, he/ she will have to seek fresh admission. In case of re-appearing at the papers, the previous year's Internal Assessment marks will be valid for the **next one year** only.

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
