## HIGHER DIPLOMA IN RUSSIAN Revised Syllabus

#### 1. General Information:

The *Higher Diploma Course in Russian* is a Course of one academic year duration (TWO SEMESTERS) after completion of the Diploma Course in Russian. There will be two classes of 60 minutes each every day for five days a week.

## 2. Eligibility:

The candidates who have passed the *Diploma Course in Russian Language* of this or any other university recognized as equivalent thereof, shall be eligible for admission to the said course.

## 3. Aims & Objectives:

- 1. Consolidating, strengthening and further developing the language skills, already learned in the Certificate and Diploma Courses.
- 2. Developing the ability to translate simple Russian texts from and into the language and initiating the learner to use the dictionary in his /her work.
- 3. Introducing the learner to specific aspects of Russian/Soviet Literature.

### **Examination:**

The **Semester Examination** of the **Higher Diploma Course in Russian** will consist of three components:

- a) Internal Assessment
  - Paper I : Modern Russian Language

- b) two WRITTEN papers -
  - Paper I : *Modern Russian Language*: of two hours duration with 40 marks
  - Paper II: Introduction to Soviet Literature: of two hours duration with 40 marks

### **Standard of Passing:**

1<sup>st</sup> Class with distinction

To pass the Higher Diploma Examination in Russian a candidate has to obtain at least 35% in written and oral examinations separately, but 40% in aggregate. Likewise, the student must also acquire a minimum of 40% in the internal assessment.

70% or more in the aggregate of the written and oral exam. 1<sup>st</sup> Class 60% or more but less than 70% in the aggregate of the written and oral exam.

2<sup>nd</sup> Class 50% or more but less 60% in the aggregate of written and oral exam.

Pass Class 40% or more but less than 50% in the aggregate of the written and oral examination.

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
